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Introduction to Course Two

Thank you for completing the first ten workbook sessions in the discipleship course, "Making Disciples Who Make Disciples." In Course Two, this book covers the next ten sessions, so it is recommended that you complete Course 1 first. You can begin to share the first course with others before completing it. Then you can begin this course. The second and share it with others too. A third shorter course will also be available.

These courses are intended for small group use and are led by disciples who have completed them. Scripture is the foundation of each session, and it can be taught by anyone who wants to help disciples grow in their relationship with Jesus.

This is not a watered-down gospel, but a challenge to live your life as Jesus taught His disciples when He walked the Earth. It is a challenge to live life according to His word and to fall deeper in love with Him and His words. It is a challenge to make disciples according to the great commission found in Matthew 28:18-20. "And Jesus spoke to them saying 'All authority has been given to me in heaven and on earth go therefore and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you and lo I am with you always even to the end of the age.'"

Blessings in your steps to go deeper and to train others.

Memorizing Scripture

Why Memorize Bible Verses?

- Jesus modeled it. He quoted the Old Testament 180 times in the New Testament.

What Is the Best Way to Memorize the Bible?

There are several ways you can try; the best is the one that works for you.

- The Navigators Topical Memory System (see navlink.org/memorize).
- Choose a gospel truth you want to understand more deeply.
- Dig into the context to increase your understanding.
- Memorizing bite-sized pieces.
- Review with friends.
- Use Bible memory apps.
- Repeat the verse and write the first letter of each word to practice recall.
- Write verses on index cards or in a notebook and review them throughout the day.
- Put verses to music.
- Write the verse and erase one word at a time while reciting.
- Display verses visibly (clothing, notebook, water bottle, etc.)

What Is the Best Way to Meditate on the Bible?

- Read a small portion and ask the Holy Spirit for understanding.
- Repeat the verse aloud.
- Ponder its meaning.
- Write it down and record what God is showing you.
- Talk to God about the verse in prayer.
- Consider how to apply it.
- Other creative methods include Bible journaling, coloring scripture, hand-lettering verses, and placing verses visibly in your home.

- Share how you used a scripture to ask for something specific.

Introduction

The Bible records many prayers. By reading these prayers and seeing how God answered them, we learn how to pray. As you read through these prayers, notice which ones you personally relate to and would like to pray.

- What are some specific areas where you would like to ask God for His blessing?

- Where would you like God to "enlarge your border" (influence, opportunities, ministry, family, etc.)?

- What areas of protection do you want to bring before God?




